Minutes – Donna Anderson February 3rd

Meeting began with different soups, crackers, side dishes and desserts. Members participated in an ice breaker because there were several new members present. Members were asked to introduce themselves, tell what their favorite quilt was and/or what quilt they would like to make.

Tami McLaren called the meeting to order. She explained that a monthly notice would be sent out to all members with the minutes of the last meeting and a link to the website where other news items would be.

Minutes of the November/December combined meeting were approved as distributed. **VP** Cheryl Budnaitis presented the proposed calendar of programs for 2026. Handout was provided. She reminded members that the Sewing Bee is every Tuesday from 10 am to 4 pm at the Hagood Community Center in Pickens. Cheryl explained that if anyone has a big quilt that needs to be prepared for quilting, the kitchen at the Hagood Community has tables that can be moved together to provide a large space for this preparation. Carol Clanton explained that the Hand sewing group will start meeting the 2nd Wednesday of the month from 1:30-4:00 pm at the Hagood Community Center. If any questions, please call Carol Clanton.

Treasurer's Report was presented by Linda Cassell. Budget will be presented at the February, 2026 meeting for approval. Any committee chair person should send their budgeted items to Linda Cassell or Tami McLaren by February 15.

Website: Janice Hinton shared that information regarding the Pigeon Forge quilt challenge is on the website.

Membership: 35 members were present with 2 new members and 1 guest. Edith Page was the winner of the name tag drawing. Marina explained that the Bylaws called for dues to be paid by January meeting, however, since that meeting was rescheduled due to weather, the decision was made to extend the deadline to the February 24, 2026 meeting. Approximately 20 members have not yet paid their dues. A roster of members will be on the website and this information is password protected.

Publicity: Tami McClaren reported she will continue in this position until it can be filled by somebody else. She shared the newspaper article on the QOV presentation that was done for the Easley National Guard.

She thanked Cathy Coster for preparing the wood bars for hanging the quilts.

Reminder: The Azalea Festival is April 25. The raffle quilt was displayed. Tickets for this quilt will be sold at different events. We also need boutique items to sell at these events. Signup sheets will be available for those wishing to help man our booths at these events.

Finishing kits for the borders and binding will be available on Tuesday Feb 24th either at the Pickens Hagood Community Center during the day or at the meeting that evening. Finished quilts will need to be turned in by the April 28th guild meeting. They will be delivered to Pigeon Forge May 15th and returned after the show June 11th.
